Tyrone Powers brought the devotional. His lesson was on the subject:

A Smart Man Seeks Wisdom (1 Kings 3:6-15)

The Lord appeared to King Solomon in a dream at night and said “Ask! What shall I give you?”⁶ And Solomon said: “You have shown great mercy to Your servant David my father, because he walked before You in truth, in righteousness, and in uprightness of heart with You; You have continued this great kindness for him, and You have given him a son to sit on his throne, as *it is* this day.

⁹ Therefore give to Your servant an understanding heart to judge Your people, that I may discern between good and evil. For who is able to judge this great people of Yours?”

¹⁰ The speech pleased the Lord, that Solomon had asked this thing. ¹¹ Then God said to him: “Because you have asked this thing, and have not asked long life for yourself, nor have asked riches for yourself, nor have asked the life of your enemies, but have asked for yourself understanding to discern justice, ¹² behold, I have done according to your words; see, I have given you a wise and understanding heart, so that there has not been anyone like you before you, nor shall any like you arise after you. ¹³ And I have also given you what you have not asked: both riches and honor, so that there shall not be anyone like you among the kings all your days. ¹⁴ So if you walk in My ways, to keep My statutes and My commandments, as your father David walked, then I will lengthen your days.”

Lessons from Solomon:

1. Seek wisdom from God.
2. Don’t seek a long life.
3. Don’t seek fame or fortune.
4. God will bless you with what you need.

Show Them My Faith by My Works

A missionary returning home after many years of service was asked, "Tell me what you found when you arrived in New Guinea."

"Found? I found something that looked more hopeless than if I had been sent into a jungle of tigers."
