AN EYE FOR AN EYE!

God is a God of justice. He cannot be less. Paul said about God’s grace in saving us through Jesus Christ, “This was to demonstrate His righteousness, because in the forbearance of God He passed over the sins previously committed; for the demonstration, I say, of His righteousness at the present time, so that He would be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus” (Romans 3:25 and 26). God could not save us without showing himself to be exactly who He is. God is totally and wholly righteous.

The phrase “eye for an eye” is used three times in the Old Testament. In Exodus 21:24, Leviticus 24:20 and Deuteronomy 19:21. Please read those verses in their context. I will be using these verses in my sermon this morning.

God’s law is always just. But it does not always seem so to us. But what is interesting to me is that in our modern and greedy world we don’t want justice. Instead of “an eye for an eye” we want “an arm, and a leg, and a house, and a boat for an eye.” Law demands justice.

But grace is so very different from Law. Grace is based of love. And love says that you do no wrong to a neighbor. Law says that justice must prevail. Grace says that love must prevail.

“But I say to you, do not resist an evil person; but whoever slaps you on your right cheek, turn the other to him also. If anyone wants to sue you and take your shirt, let him have your coat also. Whoever forces you to go one mile, go with him two. Give to him who asks of you, and do not turn away from him who wants to borrow from you” Matthew 5:39-42).

Love always goes the extra mile. Love always desires justice, but it turns the other cheek. It does this because it always desires the best for it’s object. If you love someone, you always desire the best for them. That is what God does for us. He had to be just in order to save us.
