Job’s Accuser
(Job 1:6 – 2:1)

These two scriptures tell us about the Devil entering in an assembly of the sons of God who gathered in the presence of God. There some more modern translations that render “angels” for “sons of God”, which have apparently influenced some to think that Satan entered heaven, to make his charges against Job. It is this writer’s conviction that Satan, after having been cast out of heaven, has never and will never enter heaven again, but has and will continue to meet where the sons of God are gathered. Did not Jesus in his parable of the sower point out that when the word was sown, the Devil was present to take it away? Also, do we not, when we come together in our prayers, mention of coming into the presence of God?

Satan always makes it a point to be in the presence of the righteous. This is his battleground, and he desires to inflict as much damage as possible. To accomplish his mission, he seeks to deceive, depress, discourage, insult or use whatever means he deems effective to destroy souls.

Satan attempts to put worshippers into a disinterested trance. Often, he can redirect one’s thoughts from spiritual to carnal. He can influence worshippers to go through the motions without the slightest feeling of emotions.

Satan will look for the “hearers only” and encourage them to find fault, criticize, and condemn, and while working the pews will suggest to those who are weak that they need not concern themselves with being regular attenders. His purpose is to make one as lukewarm as possible, and keep such a one from ever drawing closer to God.

So never think that Satan misses a single service. As long as there are those who gather in His presence, he will be present. He is the great discourager of the faithful and you or I might be the one he singles out to accuse.

After all, “Satan” can and sometimes is translated “Accuser”

IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT REGARDING WORSHIP SERVICES

Following Governor Abbott’s order for re-opening Texas the worship service in person is at a limited capacity.

Beginning this Sunday, May 3, we will have worship services at the building and Facebook live/online service.

If you are over the age of 65, or in a high-risk group, we encourage you to participate in our online services.

We ask that you follow the guidelines below while worshipping at the building:

- All attendees over the age of 10 will need to wear a face mask.
- The only exceptions for wearing the face mask will be when partaking of the Lord’s Supper and men that are publicly speaking while leading in our worship service.
- Enter and exit the building through the front door. This will help to minimize the touching of common items.
- For communion, we will have disposable cups. They will be available as you enter the building.
- Sit in alternate rows. Half of the auditorium rows will be closed.
- Individuals may sit with members of their household but must maintain 6 feet between members of different households.
- **There will no bible classes, evening worship, Tuesday ladies bible class or Wednesday night services at this time.**
- Please maintain social distancing while fellowshiping with other members.
