WORSHIP SERVICES

Following Governor Abbott's order for re-opening Texas the worship service in person is at a limited capacity. Beginning this Sunday, we will have worship services at the building and Facebook live/online service.

We ask that you follow the guidelines below while worshipping at the building:

- Individuals may sit with members of their household but must maintain 6 feet between members of different households.
- There will no bible classes, evening worship, Tuesday ladies bible class or Wednesday night services at this time.
- Please maintain social distancing while fellowshipping with other members. We look forward to seeing each of you this Sunday.

The world of sound is a prime means of our communication. With our ears we can hear the wonderful words of the life-giving, life-saving gospel of Christ. Some people did not listen attentively, therefore they misunderstood the message. "therefore, take care how you listen" (Luke 8:18) some people had itching ears. They were fickle hearers, looking for something new.

Yet, thankfully, there were those who listened carefully & took to heart what they heard. To these people Jesus said, "Blessed are your ... ears, because they hear" (Matt 13:16)
