WORSHIP SERVICES

Preaching and Teaching. Are they the Same?

The mission Jesus gave His disciples after His resurrection was twofold. First, Jesus wanted His followers to make disciples by heralding the good news (Matthew 28:18-20; Mark 16:15-16). What is the good news? Paul summed up the gospel in 1 Corinthians 15:3-5: Jesus died for sin according to the promise of Scripture. He was buried, and on the third day, God raised Him from the dead.

Second, Jesus commissioned His followers to teach those who believed and were baptized "to observe all things that I have commanded you" (Matthew 28:20). The same people were to herald or to preach, and they were to teach. Preaching and teaching are not airtight compartments. Teaching is the broader term and the one that requires less definition. Paul proclaimed Jesus to Jews in the synagogue in Antioch near Pisidia (Acts 13:16-41) and to Gentiles in the cities of Lystra (chap.14) and Athens (chap.17), but he also taught them.

Transfer of knowledge accompanies teaching. It includes the assimilation of information. Repeatedly, followers of Christ are called disciples, but the Greek word for disciple is a derivative of the verb "to learn." Preaching usually includes teaching, but it does more. Sometimes the preacher stirs up memory and reinforces in believers what they already know (2 Peter 1:13; 3:1). It may be said of a man, "He is a good teacher, but not a good preacher." Christians recognize that a given person may have a great deal of helpful information, but he may not be able to hold attention, inspire, and motivate. Few Christians go to sleep at night burdened by data concerning the construction of the Tabernacle. Sermons are not solely about data, but preaching should not be faulted for passing out too much information. Neither should sermons focus on the rehearsing of clever stories and personal anecdotes. Preaching is the bridging of the gap between the biblical story of grace and salvation in such a way that those who hear want to live lives modeled after and pleasing to Jesus of Nazareth.
