Candy canes were invented in the late 1600s, 1670 to be exact. They started out as sugar sticks. The man who invented them was a choir master. The reason? To keep his young singers quiet during a long ceremony. In honor of the occasion, he had the candy bent into shepherd's crooks. So, what exactly do Candy canes have to do with Jesus?

It wasn't until the turn-of-the-century that the stripes and peppermint were added. A candy maker from Indiana had an idea. He wanted to make a candy that could be a reminder of Jesus Christ. He began with a stick of pure white hard candy, the red-and-white stripes represented Christ's blood and purity. The three red stripes were also said to symbolize God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit. The hardness of the candy represented the Church's foundation on solid rock. The shape flipped upside down is a "J" to represent the precious name of Jesus.

So how did the candy cane maker use his candy cane to tell others about the Bible and our Lord Jesus?

He told people why he made it white.

God washes our sins away and makes us white as snow when we trust in Jesus as our Savior.

Isaiah 1:18: "Come now, let us reason together," says the Lord. "Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they are red as crimson, they shall be like wool."

John 10:11: "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep."

Psalm 100:3: "Know that the Lord is God. It is he who made us, and we are his; we are his people, the sheep of his pasture."

"Upside down candy cane" - if you turn the candy cane upside down though, it makes a J for Jesus!

Matthew 1:21: "She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins.

As for the candy canes peppermint flavor, it represents the use of hyssop, an herb referred to in the Old Testament.

Exodus 12:22

And just like candy the Lord's love for us grows sweeter each day.

We should all be like the candy maker and find some way to tell others about Jesus Christ.
