Andrea Rucker tests show she does not have cancer, but will need further medical treatment. She is still not feeling well.

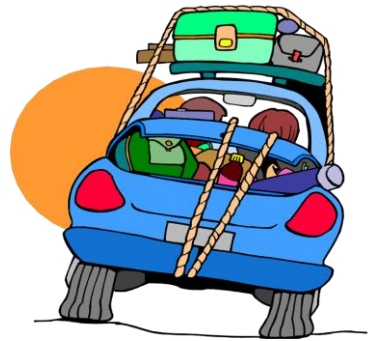
Janet Barnwell has requested prayers for her spiritual and physical wellbeing.
