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A REFRESHING BROTHER!

There are some people who are like a breath of fresh air. Just to be around them is an encouraging, uplifting experience. This must be the case with Philemon. Paul wrote a personal letter to Philemon on behalf of Onesimus. Paul wished to have Onesimus returned by Philemon to Paul to help with the work.

No doubt Paul wanted to say some things to Philemon, but I do not for one minute believe Paul would have lied or exaggerated just to get his way. Philemon is described in glowing terms by Paul. Then Paul adds, "For we have great joy and consolation in your love, because the hearts of the saints have been refreshed by you, brother." Philemon 7 NKJ

What a great thing to say about someone! What a great gift! Philemon brought great joy, consolation, and refreshing to Paul and the early Christians. Joy refers to cheerfulness or calm delight. When one came into contact with Philemon he walked away a calmer, more serene person. When life gets us bent out of shape, angry, upset, in turmoil, it is important to have someone to go to who can by a word of encouragement restore the balance of our life, get us "unbent".

Philemon was such a person. In addition, he brought great consolation or solace to others' lives. When one had experienced a great loss, trial, or tragedy, Philemon was a person one could go to and receive solace.

How many times in your life have you wished for someone just to offer a word of comfort or solace? Philemon was a person who brought such comfort.

Philemon is also spoken of having "refreshed" the hearts of the saints. When one is emotionally distressed, he longs for refreshment.

Jesus himself spoke of the reward of one who offers just a "cup of water" in the name of Jesus. Mark 9:41 Water refreshes the body and slakes the thirst. How much more valuable it is to refresh the heart!

Yet this is what is said about Philemon; he refreshed the hearts of the saints.

When one finds himself in an emotional desert, how soothing it is to have our hearts refreshed! Yes, Philemon was such a person.

Perhaps because of the context in which these things are said, Philemon does not get the recognition he deserves.

Yet, he offered such consolation, joy, and refreshing to the saints that one cannot afford to overlook such a supreme example.

There is a lesson here. Regardless of one's station in life, a slave as Onesimus or a master as Philemon, one can still be an oasis in the midst of a spiritual and emotional desert.
